Esplanade Reserve Restoration

The last stage of a project that began in 2000 between TCC, the Matua Saltmarsh Advisory Committee (since disbanded), and Matua Residents Assn to restore Matua Saltmarsh between Bellevue to the South, and Bay Street in the North, will get under way shortly. The last area is between Elmes Reserve and Bay Street.

It will take several years to re-establish native plants back in to this area where the bush has succumbed to invasive species and weed trees. Non-natives will be targeted first, weeds removed and natives planted. The Matua Estuary Care group currently undertake pest control measures to eradicate rodents, stoats and weasels. These pests threaten the survival of bird species such as the Banded Rail and North Island Fern bird.

Work is also due to begin on clearing above the storm water pipe through this area, and debate continues on whether this will become an extension of the saltmarsh walkways, as scheduled under the ten-year management plan, though not popular with all locals residents.



Emergency Response Update

We are in the process of completing an operational plan in support of the current Emergency Response Strategy for Matua. A three stage process has been decided upon:

Firstly have a plan for your own home and ensure all of the family are aware of the details.

Secondly check on your neighbors and assist those who are in need of help.

Thirdly if the need exists (major city wide disaster) head to Matua Park with the hall and bowling club as the focal point for a **community response centre**. Note this will not be an official Emergency (Civil Defence) centre and will be operated by locals reporting to the official body.

Even though we are somewhat contained within our own suburb we are part of the wider Otumoetai community so a meeting was called with delegates from Bureta, central Otumoetai and Bellevue. These areas will look at having similar plans and community response centres. While the schools have their own plans and processes for any day time emergencies they also offer a range of valuable assets. For Matua we must also be aware of Radius Matua Lifecare and even though they have a separate plan in the worst case scenario the community will need to provide support.


and can be played at all levels of ability, from the fierce competition of international matches to a quiet social

Enjoy Sport - Dealing with Overuse Injuries

Gradual Process Injuries

Gradual process injuries are those which occur over time. They may occur over a week or even over a year. They are sometimes called Occupational Overuse Syndrome [OOS] and earlier were called RSI. However these terms do not really describe the injury.

The symptoms or what you feel vary from person to person. Pain may be felt in one part of the body one day and in another the next. Tingling and numbness may also be felt. Stiffness is another symptom.

How do they occur?

They can occur from muscles and joints being held in one position over a period of time or tight muscles which over time eventually pull on tendons. For example, holding the neck in one position while at work is enough to put tension on the structures supporting the neck and thus cause pain. Running without stretching afterwards will cause the calf muscles to tighten over time, causing tension on the achilles tendons and eventually pain.

Constant tension on any soft tissue structures can cause a breakdown of the tissue which causes pain.

Examples of these injuries are shin splints, low back strain, tennis elbow, wrist and forearm pain, neck and shoulder pain.



How can physiotherapy help?

The sooner you see a physiotherapist the sooner your pain will be reduced.

- The tight muscles need to be stretched again and loosened.
- The tight nerves need to be mobilised.
- The joints which have been tightened causing a restriction in movement need to be moved and the range of movement restored.
- Muscle imbalance needs to be corrected. Sometimes the working muscles become so strong the other supporting muscles become weaker. This is referred to as a muscle imbalance.
- Posture needs to be improved.
- Advice will be provided on preventative action in the future to reduce the chances of this occurring again.

The Bridge to Where?

As you walk or ride along the Matua foreshore to and from Kulim Park you will notice a small white bridge in the garden beside the walkway. If you have been around a long time you will know that it was the bridge on the path prior to the foreshore upgrade. However most would not know that the bridge was built in 1963 by the owners of 1 Beach Road to allow the public to walk through their property which had riparian rights to the water's edge.

There was a small lagoon where the grandchildren would play when the tide was in and the bridge was placed over this and with a pumice path either side allowed the public to walk or ride between the adjoining Park on the Bureta side and Beach Road on the Matua side thus avoiding walking across the owner's lawn. At times even motorcycles and horses took this shortcut though not necessarily with the owner's blessing. Many wedding parties have had photos taken here, particularly featuring the Mount in the background.

What might have been

In the last edition of Matua Moments we highlighted the new walkway through the saltmarsh joining Sylvania Drive carpark to Elmes reserve. This whole saltmarsh area has a long and varied history and could easily have been so different today.

On very early maps the area was known to Maori as Papahenga after an abundant native shrub that was used for many purposes but no longer exists through the area.

When Otumoetai land was confiscated after the battles of Gate Pa and Te Ranga in 1878, the land was sold to private ownership and in time became the farms of the Tollemache, Snodgrass and Matheson families.

The saltmarsh originally covered a much larger area than it does today, extending beyond the railway line that was built in the mid 1920s, to the base of Otumoetai ridge. A stream and marshy land encircled the base of the higher land on which Otumoetai College, Intermediate and the Windsor Road subdivisions stand.

Turning saltmarsh into dairy farm was considered easy with the installation of a one-way flood gate system. Aerial views still show the many drainage ditches that crisscrossed the saltmarsh. Part of the land had been divided into smaller blocks for market gardens.

Today very little remains after a storm in 1969 destroyed the floodgates, and salt water once more reclaimed the area. In the same year the saltmarsh zoning was changed from rural to residential, and Kingslea Marinas Limited began to dig canals and drains for a proposed 248 section residential housing development, similar to what now exists in the Coromandel towns of Whitianga and Pauanui.

Concerned by this proposal the Native Forest Action Council and the Tauranga branch of the Royal Forest and Bird Protection Society took a case to the Planning Tribunal, and in 1970 the Council's rezoning was overturned.

In an agreement between the City Council, the Conservation Department and the Queen Elizabeth 11 National Trust 25 hectares was placed under a covenant to protect the future use of the land.

Tauranga Half Marathon

April 10th sees the 11th running of a series of run/walks through the suburb streets, walkways and along the harbor foreshore. Several hundred people get out and enjoy participating on the distances of 21, 14 and 7km that are on offer, be they serious runners or casual walkers. There is also a 1km run for children around Fergusson Park.

Participants can register online, the night before or on the day at the OSRC Clubrooms by the carpark. OSRC members act as event marshalls as a fundraiser for their clubrooms and proceeds from the event go to the Heart Foundation.

Many businesses sponsor teams of their workers as a social event to build team spirit and family teams also participate.
